Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.

Hebrews 12:1-2 (ESV)

Have someone read:

At Glorybound we thought about how others label us and how we label ourselves.

While all labels are not necessarily a bad thing, they can be harmful when we allow them to identify us. At Glorybound we heard that at our baptism, God placed His label on us and it says "My Child". This label is not a visible one, but it can be seen in the way we live. We have been marked by "Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God." As a child of God, we are called to "run with endurance the race that is set before us" as we follow Jesus as His disciples. This is more than merely believing in Jesus, it is following His ways. Following Christ only happens through the power of the Holy Spirit that God has promised us. The Holy Spirit gives us the power to stand firm and run the race God has placed on us for all those around us to see, identifying us as belonging to Him.

<u>Discuss</u> How do you think of yourself somewhat differently as a result of what you learned at Glorybound?

What does it mean to you that Jesus loved you so much that He "endured the cross" and all the shame that went with it in order to save you from sin, death and the devil?

If you were to describe the "race that is set" before you what does it look like on a daily basis? What parts of it do you enjoy "running" and what parts of it do you especially need Jesus' help with?

How are the youth and adults at our church part of your *great cloud of witnesses*? If you were to tell them what encourages you most in running your race as a child of God, what would that look like? What kinds of words or actions do you find encouraging?

Is there anything else anyone in our group would like to share about our experience together?
